Established in 2025 to honour the late Graham Pawlett, he was a dedicated Canadian Volunteer Fire Services Association (CVFSA) board member, serving for 12 years. Graham volunteered his time, professionalism and expertise, and this will never be forgotten. Graham was the Past President of the Canadian Volunteer Fire Services Association, Inaugural Chair of the CAFC Cancer Committee as well as a member of the CAFC National Advisory Council.

Eligible applicants are CVFSA members or dependent children of members who are pursuing their goal of higher education under the age of 25.

Applicants must be in the process or have been accepted at an accredited university or college to pursue a course of study which will lead to a recognized degree.

The award which shall be given annually: \$1,500

The awarding of the scholarship will be based on the academic standing of the applicant and their involvement with school and community.
